

Archery NZ Criteria for FITA World Cup 2012 Events Policy



The qualifying criteria for the FITA World Cup 2012 Events being held in various location throughout 2012 have been outlined below.

In order to be considered for this event, archers **must** now adhere to the following new rules:

- 1) formally apply to the Archery NZ selectors as listed below
- 2) submit appropriate qualifying scores within one week of the end of the qualifying period.
- 3) return regular results from tournaments to the Selectors to show they are still shooting and making progress between selection and the event itself.

These first 2 points above will result in the filling in of a new Archery NZ International Event Selection Registration Form, which is available on the Archery NZ website, or can be emailed from any of the selectors.

Each of the three World Cup events will have a different qualifying period lasting thirteen months. Scores from overlapping qualifying periods will be considered for selection for multiple World Cup events.

The World Cups and dates are as follows:

World Cup Stage 1, Shanghai	China	10th to 15th April 2012
World Cup Stage 2, Antalya	Turkey	1st to 6th May 2012
World Cup Stage 3, Ogden	USA	17th to 23rd June 2012

The World Cup Stage 3 in Ogden, USA, is being held in conjunction with the Final Olympic Qualifying Tournament.

Three scores are required to have been shot during the qualifying period at no less than a major tournament, domestically or internationally.

The criteria are as follows:

	Compound	FITA: 1350; FITA 50m on the 6 ring face: 659
Men	Recurve	FITA: 1240; FITA 70m: 619
	Compound	FITA: 1360; FITA 50m on the 6 ring face: 679

Qualifying period

World Cup Stage 1, Shanghai	China	5th Dec 2010 to 5th Jan 2012
World Cup Stage 2, Antalya	Turkey	22nd Dec 2010 to 22nd Jan 2012
World Cup Stage 3, Ogden	USA	11th Feb 2011 to 11th March 2012

Achieving the above scores in the required qualifying period does not mean automatic selection to the intended World Cup event. There may be the requirement to compete in a trial event for selection to the intended World Cup event. The venue for trials will be at the discretion of the Archery NZ Selection Panel. Failure to compete in required trials will automatically exclude you from selection for said event.

Post selection for this event, there may be a requirement for all archers selected to attend a training squad session as deemed necessary by the Selectors and/or officials involved in this event.
