ALL MEMBERS AFFILIATED TO ARCHERY NEW ZEALAND

Dear Colleagues

Set out below are the motions to be presented to the Archery NZ Annual General Meeting in Whitianga on Thursday, 9 January 2014.

The Constitutional amendment has been proposed by the Board and will need a two-thirds majority to be approved.

The amendments to the Rules have been approved by the Board and, like all Rule changes, need ratification, or not, by the AGM with a simple majority.

No new rules or amendments had been received from Clubs by the due date of 1 November 2013.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

That clause 10.2 be amended to read:

10.2 The financial year of the Association will be from **1 July** in any one year to **30 June** the following year.

Rationale

There have been difficulties with auditors completing their role and making available the documents in time before Christmas when many of the companies close for several weeks. The auditing rules these days require considerably greater work from the Treasurer. It is a pressured time to prepare the documentation for the auditors at the time of greatest income from new and renewed membership applications, much of which has to be excluded from the work given to the auditors.

This is purely a change to the financial year and will make no difference to the shooting year which will remain 1 October to 30 September.

The change will take effect for the current period, which will therefore be for only the 9 months ending on 30 June 2014.

AMENDMENTS TO RULES

Shooting Rules

1 That the expression "FITA" be removed in all places it occurs and be replaced by

the number of arrows to be shot in that round, the possible score, or other appropriate expression as determined by World Archery.

Rationale

The expression no longer exists and the names of rounds to be shot were changed at the World Archery Congress in September 2013. For example the "FITA round" will become the "1440 round". This applies to target, match play, field and 3D.

The various "FITA" badges will remain under the same conditions but be the "World Archery----".

2 12.3 Clout distances

Delete the current lists and replace with:

- 165 m **Recurve** Masters Men / Men / Junior men

Rationale

This motion clarifies the distances to be shot by the various divisions.

AMENDMENTS TO THE TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS

- 3 Where there are insufficient entries (ie fewer than 4) to run a recurve cadet 60m match play round, the cadets may choose to shoot in the recurve 70m match play round, in which case their results would be extracted from the 70m ranking round and added to their placings in the 1440 round to calculate the target medals. If they chose to shoot down in the JAMA group the placings would not count for the cadet target medals because of the shorter distances.

Rationale

This motion clarifies the way of assessing the scores to be used for the recurve cadet archers target medals in certain circumstances.

4 Champion of Champions

That the Regulation 2.5.7.1 be amended to read:

These trophies will be awarded to the woman, man, JAMA woman and man, senior woman and man, each of whom accumulates the most points through competing in all of the events of the National Championships, and will be awarded in both recurve and compound divisions. Points will be awarded as follows:

First place = 10pts

Second place = 9pts and so on down to 10th place = 1pt.

Where the recurve cadets shoot in the recurve 70m match play round when no recurve 60m match play round is provided, the cadets will be ranked against each other, eg a cadet finishes 7th overall but is the 1st placed cadet will be accorded 10 points, etc.

In the event of a tie, the person with most number of first places would be declared the winner. If still a tie the person with the most number of second places would be declared the winner. If still a tie, the person with the most number of third placings would be declared the winner. If it is still a tie they will be declared equal champions and share the trophy over the year.

Rationale

This simply clarifies the way in which the Champion of Champions trophies are awarded and provides the same method of calculating the winners for all divisions.

5 Refunds

That Regulation 1.4 be amended by the addition of a new clause:

In the event of an archer withdrawing from a tournament, the following rules apply:

- Prior to a week from the tournament date, a full refund should be expected.
- In the week leading up to the tournament:
 - o A full refund should be expected if the place is filled by another competitor.

- A refund of 80% should be expected if the place remains empty

The refund levels are set to ensure tournament organisers do not incur significant losses.

In the event that competitors fail to attend the tournament due to circumstances beyond their control, the board advises the Local Organising Committee should address the matter of refunds on a case by case basis.

Rationale

There needs to be guidelines on what should happen when people pay to enter a tournament and then withdraw. There needs to be a reasonable refund to the archer but the organisers are entitled to recoup most of their costs.
