

Event Format for College Sport Archery

An interschool competition can be started in a region with as little as 3 schools and 24 archers.

The format currently used in Auckland for the College Sport Archery league consists of:

- 30 arrows at 18m, 6 arrow ends, 10 zone scoring
- One 6-arrow sighting end to start
- Individual and Team Event
- Each shoot takes approximately 1 hour.

Face Sizes

- 80cm full face for Recurve and Barebow/Longbow
- 40cm full face for Compound

Bow Types and Divisions:

- **Recurve/ Barebow combined Teams:** 4 archers of any age and gender.
- Compound Pairs: 2 archers of any age and gender. (If you have sufficient archers)
- Recurve Individuals
- Compound Individuals
- Barebow/Longbow Individuals (if you have sufficient archers)
- If any school does not have enough archers to make a team, their archers can enter into the individual competition only. All archers entered in a team are automatically entered into the individual competition.

Competition Format

The event runs for 5 weeks of competition with 6 teams per division. The team competition is a round robin format, with each team playing every other team once. Each match is a competition based on cumulative score for each team with the total team score at the end determining placings for the match.

Points for teams shall be allocated as follows:

Win 3 points
Draw 1 point
Loss 0 points
Abandoned match 1 point each
Default win 3 points
Default loss 0 points

All archers also compete in an individual competition which runs alongside the team event with each archer being awarded ranked points based on their score each week. Final placings are based on total cumulative ranked points.











Grades

Teams will be seeded into divisions (Division 1, Division 2 etc.) based on results from the ranking round which is held a week before the competition starts. This is only required if there are more than 6 recurve or compound teams entered and is the same format as for the competition.

Team Management

There must be a school-approved adult in charge of their students at any venue for the entirety of the match where a school is competing.

Supervisors should identify themselves to each other at the start of the match.

School Managers must ensure that they are familiar with the health and safety regulations and that they have communicated these protocols to all their students.

If there is no supervision, a school will be deemed to have lost by default, and they shall not participate in the shoot. All Managers/supervisors are responsible for the health and safety of the students.

Equipment

Equipment shall be dictated by World Archery rules for classification. Schools using the NASP programme shall compete in the recurve discipline.

Schools must all provide their own equipment including armguards, apart from targets and buttresses.

Results

Results in Auckland are collated by the Club and then posted on the College Sport website due to the fact that we run both an individual and team event concurrently. Auckland Archery Club are happy to share the results format with any interested club.
