National Team Campaign #1
Senior Events 2020**

**ATHLETE SELECTION
PROCEDURE**

1. Definitions

In this Policy, the following definitions apply:

"Archery NZ" means Archery New Zealand (Inc)

"Board" means Board of Archery NZ

"DFSNZ" means Drug Free Sport NZ

"IOC" means International Olympic Committee

"IPC" means International Paralympic Committee

"MQS" mean Minimum Qualifying Score

"NZOC" means New Zealand Olympic Committee

"WA" means World Archery

"WADA" means World Anti-Doping Agency

"WC" means World Archery World Cup

2. Objective

The objective of this Selection procedure is to select archers for the Archery NZ representative teams for the 2020 season. Its purpose is to:

- outline the steps necessary for NZ archers to earn national team selection to compete at senior international events such as World Archery World Cups, Oceania Championships, Asian and European Grand Prix plus other WA outdoor target events in 2020 (excluding the Tokyo Olympics) or any other event that mirrors the international events as stated above.
- support (as resources permit) those archers who are selected to the national team with at least one Training Camp, with the possibility of this increasing to two or three camps.
- ensure that Archery NZ Performance and Development archers are given every chance (as resources permit) to improve, with the aim of selected NZ teams performing with distinction at key events.

3. Eligibility

To be considered for NZ Archery team selection to attend International Events, an Archer must:

- Meet the Selection Criteria and requirements as detailed in this Policy;
- If selected as a senior Compound archer, commit to competing in at least one World Cup stage in 2020 ;
- If selected as a senior Recurve archer, commit to competing at World Cups 1 & 2 2020;
- Be a current and full financial member of Archery NZ;
- Be a New Zealand Citizen or Permanent Resident;
- Hold a valid passport which at the date of the events selected for, has at least 6 months validity remaining;
- Not have any outstanding liabilities to Archery NZ at the time of the selection event, nor on leaving for international events;
- Not be under investigation for any breach of, nor to have breached, any rule under the Archery NZ Constitution, the Archery NZ Regulations or Policies, Archery Team Agreement & Code of Conduct or any rules or regulations of World Archery, the IOC¹ or the NZOC;
- Not be under investigation or have been charged for any breach of, or anti-doping rule violation under, any part of the Archery NZ Anti-Doping Regulation (which includes the Sports Anti-Doping Rules), the DFSNZ or WA Anti-Doping Regulations, or the WADA Code;
- Have completed and returned by the required dates all relevant paperwork including The 2020 Team Agreement and Code of Conduct plus a copy of their current valid passport.

3.1 Minimum qualifying scores (MQS)

A minimum of 2 Minimum qualifying score (MQS) as listed below, one of which must be at a Major domestic or International tournament, and a maximum of 1 MQS can be shot at a registered minor tournament (RMT) for a 72 arrow round within the 12 months prior to the date of the selection event list at the end of this section;

4. Removal of Archers

An archer who is to be nominated to the Team by Archery NZ may be removed as a nominee for any of the following reasons, as determined by Archery NZ:

- a. Voluntary withdrawal. An archer must submit a written letter to Archery NZ via the Selection Convener and/or HP Manager.
- b. Injury or illness as certified by an Archery NZ approved physician (or medical staff) and a medical certificate provided to Archery NZ via the Selection Convener and/or National Coach. If an archer refuses verification of his/her illness or injury by a physician (or medical staff), his/her injury will be assumed to be disabling and he/she may be removed.
- c. Violation of the Archery NZ Member Protection Policy and/or the 2020 Team Agreement & Code of Conduct including non-payment of invoices relating to International events. Any archer who is removed from the Team has the right to an appeal.
- d. Any archer may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team for an adjudicated violation of IOC, IPC, WADA, WA, NZOC, DFSNZ and Archery NZ anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures, as applicable.

5. Required Documents

As a condition of nomination to the 2020 Archery NZ National Team Campaign #1 the following documents are required to be signed by an archer & forwarded within 2 weeks of selection:

- 2020 Archery NZ Team Agreement & Code of Conduct (available at <http://www.archerynz.co.nz>)
- Copy of a valid Passport

6. Training Camps

The date and location of the training camp or camps will be announced to the Team members at least 30 days in advance of the event/training. However, Archery NZ will endeavor to announce the dates and locations as far in advance as possible. Funding will be sought to fully or partially subsidise the archers for the camps. All archers must attend the first camp and there is an expectation that archers will also attend any other subsequent camps.

7. Anti-doping Requirements

Archers must adhere to all IOC, IPC, WADA, WA, DFSNZ and Archery NZ anti-doping protocols, policies and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing as required by the IOC, IPC, WADA, WA, NZOC and DFSNZ Rules, as applicable.

8. International Disclaimer

These procedures are based on IOC, IPC, as applicable, and/or World Archery rules and regulations as presently known and understood. Any change in the selection procedures caused by a change in IOC, IPC, as applicable, and/or World Archery rules and regulations will be distributed to the affected archers immediately. The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to Archery NZ. However, the selections are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency.

If any force of nature, or force majeure, should cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures will be revised, and approved by the Board of Archery NZ.

9. Board Notification

The Board of Archery NZ will be required to ratify the 2020 National Team Campaign #1 Selection and until such time as the Board makes a formal Team Announcement, archers are to refrain from publishing on Social Media that they have been selected for the National Team.

2020 Archery NZ National Team Campaign #1 Senior Selection Event Trials

Event Schedule:

15th, 16th & 17th November 2019, Randwick Archery Club, Randwick Rd, Moera, Lower Hutt 5010

3 days:

- Friday 15th Practice (not compulsory) from 1pm
- Saturday 16th morning - 72 arrow qualification Round
- Saturday 16th afternoon - round 1 of round robin individual Match Play
- Sunday 17th morning - 30 minutes of practice followed by round 2 of the round robin individual Match Play
- Sunday 17th afternoon after Team announcement - Recurve Mixed Teams Round Robin Event

1. Trial Details

1.1. 72 Arrow Qualification Round

1.1.1. One 72 Arrow Qualification Round will be shot and ranking points will be allocated to the top eight archers according to their ranking at the conclusion of the Qualification Round. Recurve archers will shoot 70m and Compound archers will shoot 50m. Points will be allocated according to Table 1 opposite:

1.1.2. The 72-arrow qualification round will be competed according to World Archery Rules.

1.1.3. A tie in cumulative score following the 72 arrow Qualification Round for the 8th position will be broken with a single arrow shoot-off, in accordance with World Archery Rules section 14.5.2.

1.1.4. A tie within the top 8 archers from the 72 arrow Qualification will be broken by the total number of 10's followed by the total number of X's.

1.1.4.1. If a tie still exists between two or more archers, the tied archers will receive the same ranking and points associated with that ranking.

1.1.4.2. The next lower ranked archer will receive the ranking y places down from the ranking of the tied archers where y is the number of archers tied. For example, if three archers tie for 2nd place score with the same number of 10's

and X's, then those three archers will receive the 2nd ranking for the Qualification Round and will receive 7 points. The next lower ranked archer would be 5th ranked in the Qualification Round and receive 4 points.

1.2. Qualification Round Bonus Points

1.2.1. Following the 72-arrow qualification round, Qualification Round Bonus Points will be awarded according to Table 2:

1.3. Cut to top eight (8)

1.3.1. Following the completion of the Qualification Round, Qualification Round Ranking Points and Qualification Round Bonus Points will be totaled for each archer.

1.3.2. The top 8 Men and Top 8 Women, based on total Points, will continue to the Round Robin Matches. All other archers will be eliminated from the nomination process.

1.3.3. If an archer qualifying for the Round Robin Matches withdraws prior to the start of the Round Robin Matches, the next highest ranked archer from the Total Points standings will be allowed to compete in Round Robin Matches and will receive no qualification round ranking points.

1.4. Round Robin Matches

1.4.1. In the fourteen Round Robin Matches, each male archer will shoot against each other male archer in the same division twice and each female archer will shoot against each other female archer in the same division twice.

1.4.2. Each Round Robin Match will be conducted using the Set-Play System for Recurve archers and the Compound Round for Compound archers using 15 arrow cumulative score (three arrow ends, 2 minutes per end).

1.4.3. Awarded Match Bonus Points – one point will be given for a win and zero for a loss, in each of the seven matches, and as per WA rules there will be a one arrow shoot off.

1.4.4. If an archer withdraws from the Round Robin Matches after competition has commenced, all archers will receive a win bonus point

for the match shot against the withdrawn archer, regardless of whether they won or lost the match against the withdrawn archer.

1.5. Three Arrow End Average

1.5.1. Following the series of fourteen matches, archers will be ranked and awarded points according to their Three Arrow End Average for the scores shot during the Round Robin portions of the event.

1.5.2. Three Arrow End Scores will be recorded for each match against other archers, per category, in Round Robin Match Play.

1.5.3. The Three Arrow End Average will be rounded to the thousandth place.

1.5.4. End scores shot during bye matches will not be calculated in the Three Arrow End average.

1.5.5. Points will be allocated according to the archer's Three Arrow End Average Ranking, as shown in Table 3 opposite:

1.5.6. If an archer withdraws from competition during the Round Robin Matches, archers who have shot against that archer prior to that archer withdrawing, will have their match score shot against the withdrawn archer count towards their Three Arrow End Average.

1.5.6.1. Archers who did not shoot against the withdrawn archer prior to that archer withdrawing will receive a bye and will not score their ends shot in the bye match. These arrows shot in this situation will NOT count toward the archer's Three Arrow End Average.

1.5.7. If a tie exists between two or more archers in the Three Arrow End Average for the trials event, the tied archers will receive the same ranking and points associated with that ranking.

1.5.7.1. The next lower ranked archer will receive the ranking y places down from the ranking of the tied archers where y is the number of archers tied. For example, if three archers tie for 2nd place score with the same Three Arrow End Average, then those three archers will receive the 2nd ranking for the Three Arrow End Average and will receive 7 points. The next lower ranked archer would be 5th ranked in the Three Arrow End Average and receive 4 points.

2. Archery NZ National Team Campaign #1 2020 TRIAL – Final Rankings

- 2.1. Archers will be ranked by the total cumulative points of the: Qualification Round points, Qualification Round Bonus Points, Round Robin Win points, and Three Arrow Average points. Final Rankings for this trials event will be defined by this ranking of total cumulative points.
- 2.2. In the event of a tie for the 3rd position of the Final Rankings for the trials:
 - 2.2.1. The tie will be broken using a Set-Play System Match for Recurve and a Compound Round for Compound, three arrow ends.
 - 2.2.2. If more than 2 archers are tied for the 3rd position, the two archers with the highest Three Arrow End Average outlined in Section 1.5 will shoot for the higher ranking position. For example, if three archers are tied for the 3rd position, the two archers with the highest three arrow average from the Round Robin matches from the trials event will shoot a match for 3rd place. The archer with the lowest Three Arrow End Average will be ranked 5th.
 - 2.2.3. If more than 2 archers meet the requirements for the tie breaker match or if two or more archers tie to be the 2nd person for the tie breaker match, a single arrow shoot-off will be used to separate the tie and determine the two archers that will shoot the match against each other.
- 2.3. In the event of a tie for all positions other than 3rd, the tie will be broken by using the Three Arrow End Average from the Round Robin portion of the trials event.
 - 2.3.1. The archer with the higher Three Arrow End Average as described in section 1.7 will receive the higher final ranking.
 - 2.3.2. If a tie still exists, the archer with the higher cumulative Qualification Round Score from the trials events will receive the higher final ranking.
 - 2.3.3. If a tie still exists, the tie will be broken with a single arrow shoot-off, in accordance with World Archery Rules 14.5.
- 2.4. Upon completion of the trials event the Point Totals become final.
- 2.5. Up to the top 4 archers in each gender and division will be nominated to Archery NZ National Team Campaign #1 2020 for World Cups and have first right of refusal for Team spots for the Oceania Championships 2020 as per section 10 below.
- 2.6. Archers nominated to the Archery NZ National Teams Campaign #1 2020 must stay for a meeting with the Archery NZ Selection Convener immediately after the trials event.

10. Selection Event Details

- 10.1 Upon completion of the Selection Event the placings become final.
- 10.2 Up to 4 archers in each senior gender and division from the top 4 will be nominated to 2020 Archery NZ National Team for World Cups 2020 & have the first right of refusal to the 3 places for the Oceania Championships (offered in the order of the final position from the Selection Event e.g. #1, #2 & #3 are offered first, if one or more do not take up the places, #4 will be offered next

and so forth). Archers 5-8 will be nominated for the Archery NZ Team for all Asia Cup Events & any vacant spots for Oceania Championships 2020 that may be available (offered in the order of the final position from the Selection Event as detailed above).

10.3 Archers nominated to the 2020 Archery NZ National Teams must stay for a meeting with the Archery NZ Selection Convener immediately after the Selection Event.

Please note there will be no MQS policy for spaces in the 2020 season. Archery NZ do reserve the right to offer any available spaces if they so choose, to archers who's performance may enhance or compliment the team.

11. Additional Rules Regarding 2020 Archery NZ National Teams Trial - Archery Selection Process

11.1 World Archery Rules apply to all components of the Archery NZ National Team Campaign #1.

11.2 There will be no allowance for equipment failures during the Match Play Matches.

11.3 Archers are responsible for ensuring their scores are correct. If a scoring mistake is discovered after final positions are awarded, the score may not be considered in accordance with established Archery NZ scoring procedures.

11.4 Upon commencement of the Match Play Matches, the Qualification Round Scores are considered final.

11.5 If an archer withdraws from the Selection Event for any reason other than the reasons listed below that archer may be subject to a Code of Conduct Violation or match fixing violation for affecting the outcome of a Selection Event and may have to appear before the Complaints Committee for a hearing which could result in a sanction.

11.5.1 Death in the immediate family. Immediate family defined as your Partner and parents, children, step children, fostered or adopted children, brothers, sisters, grandchildren, or grandparents, of either you or your Partner.

11.5.2 Serious injury preventing the archer from competing. Serious injury is defined as one of the following:

11.5.3 injury requiring emergency medical treatment where the archer is hospitalised for one or more days that prevents an archer from traveling or competing at the event.

11.5.4 injury requiring emergency medical treatment where the archer is treated by a physician and not allowed to compete due to doctor's orders.

11.6 In the event of inclement weather, Archery NZ will make every attempt to complete the trials procedures as written; however, if weather or any other circumstance prevents the completion of the selection procedures, modified format, schedule and procedures will be posted and announced as soon as possible.

13 Appeals

Any Appeals regarding non selection to or removal from the National Team will be made in writing to the "Complaints Panel" (this panel will be convened by the Board of Archery NZ as required) via the Administration Manager, Archery NZ. administration@archerynz.co.nz and accompanied by a \$100 Appeal Fee.
