World Archery News

Former World Archery president Francesco Gnecchi-Ruscone dies aged 98.

He served as president from 1977 to 1989, and died in Milan on 20 September 2022 after a period of ill health.

World Archery to launch archery+ OTT platform with StreamViral

World Archery is set to launch an online streaming platform called archery+ in early 2023 as part of a new partnership with technology company StreamViral.

archery+ will broadcast international archery to audiences in territories that are not covered by World Archery's rights deals. Coverage will include marquee events like the Hyundai Archery World Cup, the Hyundai World Archery Championships and upcoming qualifiers for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games - as well as second-tier world ranking tournaments.

Hamish Ashton now a Para Classifier for Archery

Very recently Archery NZ was able to obtain the services of Hamish Ashton a physiotherapist based in Tauranga as a Para Classifier for Archery.

Hamish already a Para Classifier for Shooting agreed to take time out from his very busy schedule to attend an Archery Para Classifier Course in Australia. The course headed by Nancy Littke, World Archery's head classifier and Marinder an Australian International classifier was over two days and contained both theory and practical components, which Hamish passed.

This means any archer in New Zealand who wishes to pursue archery as a Para athlete now has the means to obtain an initial classification. The classification found process can be https://paralympics.org.nz/pathway/class ification/ where the procedure is fully outlined. To enable those who are seeking this Hamish will be available for classifying at the Archery NZ Nationals to be held in Cambridge in January.

Appointments can be made for the practice day and will be in completed in privacy. Be aware that the paperwork needed before classification can take upwards of at least one month and need to be signed off preferably a month before the appointment.

For full classification to compete in an overseas tournament, it will require two classifications by separate classifiers which at this time can only be completed in Australia, however having Hamish do an initial classification will enable an archer to understand what they need to do, coupled with an Archery New Zealand Judges assessment of any equipment required.

Archery NZ is excited with this appointment, marking a major step forward to make archery more inclusive for all who wish to pursue our wonderful sport.

Records

Recently a number of NZ-affiliated archers headed overseas to shoot in tournaments and in doing so shot NZ records. However, the Archery NZ shooting rules did not allow for such records to be ratified. There were also a couple of other instances where clarification on the method of claiming a record was needed.

With a view to providing clarity on what scores can be claimed as an NZ record, making Archery inclusive and removing needless barriers, ensuring that Archery NZ members can claim scores regardless of individual locality and tournament locality, protecting the value of an Archery NZ membership and make the application and administration of the records as easy as possible when such results are not published in Archery OSA, the Board consulted with the Records Officer, Judges and your Athlete Representatives and have amended the shooting rules.

The new shooting rules are <u>available</u> <u>here</u>. Please review the complete document if you haven't done so for a while, the changes to the records eligibility can be found in Section 5.

Please note that because Archery OSA does not include results from overseas tournaments, the onus is on archers to apply for their records. Please use the following page on the archery NZ website to claim records affected by these changes:
