



77th Archery NZ National Outdoor Target & Open Championships 2020

Auckland 6th – 9th February

An invitation is extended to all archers & arbalests to come and enjoy with us the 77th Archery New Zealand National Outdoor Target & Open Championships 2020. The National Championships aim to cater for all archers regardless of ability or skill level. We would like to see as many archers as possible at the event to enjoy the fun, friendship and competition.

The Target Championships will be decided on the results of a WA 72 arrow round. Individual and Mixed Team match play events will also be held for the Recurve and Compound archers. Crossbow will shoot IR900 rounds.

Youth events are designed to accommodate the younger archers with distances appropriate to their age and skill levels and with helpers to assist with scoring. The Senior & Masters rounds will comply with the World Archery distances. Rounds to be shot are on following pages.

This is a major tournament for which the Archery NZ dress-code will apply.

A reminder that if club uniforms are worn it must be the entire uniform, only the current New Zealand representative uniforms. No denim and no camo clothing. Please encourage your archery friends and your supporters to join you in 2020 at the 77th Archery New Zealand National Outdoor Target & Open Championships 2020 and to participate at whatever level you all enjoy. We also invite overseas archers and archers from other organisations to join us at this event and look forward to seeing you in February 2020

Eligibility

You must be a paid Full Senior or Full Junior shooting member for the 2019-2020 season. ID card will be required to be shown at registration.

Overseas archers will need to be affiliated to their respective countries to World Archery or the World Crossbow Shooting Association (WCSA) and are not eligible for Archery NZ trophies, but are eligible for Nationals Open records & medals.

Shooting Rules

This tournament will be run in accordance with the current rules of Archery NZ, World Archery & WCSA Rules.

Anti-Doping

Archery NZ works in partnership with Drug Free Sport New Zealand to promote and manage compliance with the Sports Anti-Doping Rules made by Drug Free Sport New Zealand, and any amendments to or replacements of those Rules.

Archery NZ would like to remind people that they are responsible for what they put into their bodies and that some supplements can cause anti-doping rule violations through contamination. Archery New Zealand take no responsibility for what any supplements may contain.

Entries

Entries are via the Archery OSA platform. <https://www.archeryosa.com/>

Senior & Masters Divisions \$150pp & Youth Divisions \$120pp. The fee is set for the division you enter to shoot in for this event.

Entries & payment of will close at midnight on the 17th January 2020. Entries from the 18th January until midnight on the 31st January 2020 will incur a \$20 late entry fee. No entries will be accepted after the 31st January.

Please note: If you have entered but not paid in full within the dates stated then you will either incur a late fee or will not be entered into the tournament.

If you wish to withdraw your entry, this must be done prior to 31st December 2019 for a full refund, or 17th January for an 80% refund.

Refunds after this time are subject to Archery NZ's discretion.

We prefer the overseas archers to pay in New Zealand dollars on registration day. To secure a place on the line entry forms must be received prior to closing date or the late

fee will apply. If you have entered and do not attend without cancelation you will be billed for your entry fee.

Banquet

Once you have entered the event you will receive an email regarding the purchase of Banquet Tickets. Tickets will be \$65 per person. Our venue has a maximum of 150 for a seated dinner, so these will be on a first ordered & paid, first served basis.

9am 30 minute practice followed by Official Opening of the event.

At the conclusions of the Opening the 72 arrow qualification round will commence (incorporates qualification round for Aussie MP Series in the senior divisions)

Individual Match Play early rounds (senior division incorporates Aussie MP Series)

Target Championships medal Presentation end of the shooting day.

9am Mixed Teams Match Play

Afternoon:

Individual Match Play - continuation (senior division incorporates Aussie MP Series)

Sunday 9th

Morning:

Completion of Mixed Team's & Individual Match Play up to medal matches for Senior - To completion for other divisions – unless there is ample time on the program then Junior & Cadet finals will shift to Afternoon. Youth divisions may require mixed divisions for team's match play.

Finals Mixed Team's –Senior

Finals Individuals - Senior (Senior incorporates Aussie MP Series)

Monday 10th Pack up

If you are available to assist with pack up at the conclusion of shooting on Sunday the 9th it would be appreciated as many hands make this a quick task.

Please note the 72 arrow qualification round will be used for the Australian Match Play Series New Zealand stage. This is open to those who shoot in the Senior/Open divisions only, and will be automatic entry for those who enter these divisions. The Individual Match Play matches are also part of the Australian Match Play Series New Zealand stage.

There must be a minimum of 4 archers in the Match Play category for it to go ahead. There must be a minimum of 4 arbalists for there to be a crossbow competition.
